

Overview

If you are intending to work as a professional massage therapist you will need to complete the Certificate IV in MassageTherapy Practice (HTL40307).

Your qualification is gained by completing 'delivery modules' that align to the units of competencies for this nationally recognised qualification. The Certificate IV Massage Therapy Practice (HLT40307) by part-time learning consists of 9 delivery modules including:

- Module Swedish Massage
- Module Remedial Massage
- Module Anatomy and Physiology
- Module Sports Massage
- Module Elective Massage (your choice)
- Module Safe Practices for Natural Therapists
- · Module Practice Management, Law & Ethics
- Module Student clinic
- Module First Aid (Students have the option to complete externally at their own cost).

Flexible study options

Core modules are offered every term, giving students flexibility to design a program to suit their own needs. For example, if you have work commitments then you may choose to study part-time and undertake one module per term. Other students who are keen to achieve their qualifications as soon as possible can plan a full-time program to compete the course in 20 weeks.


When can I start?

Professional Qualification diploma of remedial massage

Overview

The Diploma of Remedial Massage is recommended for practitioners looking to upgrade their skills and education qualifications.

Your qualification is gained by completing 'delivery modules' that align to the units of competencies for this nationally recognised qualification. The Diploma of Remedial Massage consists of 6 delivery modules including:

- Advanced Remedial Massage
- Advanced Anatomy & Physiology
- Professional Development
- Massage Elective 1 (your choice)
- Massage Elective 2 (your choice)
- Student Clinic





The delivery of the program is highly flexible. Each module can be completed separately or together. It will suit practitioners who are currently working in the industry and looking for a simple path to upgrade their qualification.

What are the pre-requisites?

Enrolment into the program first requires completion of the Certificate IV in Massage Therapy Practice (HLT40307). Students are able to commence their Diploma elective modules whilst completing the Certificate IV in Massage Therapy Practice.

When can I start?

The program can be commenced at any time throughout the year. Please contact the School or download the latest timetable from our website.



The Swedish Massage course is designed as the entry level to massage therapy. This course enables total beginners as well as people with some knowledge of massage to reach a clinical standard within ten weeks.

You will learn how to give a complete, effective, relaxation massage. You will also learn a shiatsu (acupressure) routine seated neck and shoulder massage.

This course focuses on the needs of people who want to massage friends and family or to practise massage within an existing clinical framework such as nurses, counsellors, beauty therapists, and sports people.

This course is also the first step towards becoming a professional Massage Therapist.



swedish

Overview

Swedish Massage is a hands-on course of 10 classes. Generally the first hour of class is spent learning theory components of massage and observing a practical demonstration.

The remaining time is spent practising the particular techniques under supervision. This means giving and receiving a massage every class!

Module Certificate

You will be awarded your certificate upon successful completion of the assessments as well as satisfactory performance at 3×5 hour student clinics.


general interest

student massage clinic

As part of each hands-on course, you will undertake a certain number of clinic hours, where you massage the general public under the supervision of a teacher at the school campus.

Student Massage Clinic provides a safe environment where you will be able to develop and practice your skills and build confidence as a massage therapist.

Student clinics are run on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays and all towels are provided



Here are just some of the massage modules you can explore...

remedial

This course builds upon your foundation of Swedish massage and is the next step toward your professional accreditation. You will learn to work with greater knowledge and confidence and learn to use a broad range of very effective treatments drawn from both Western and Eastern healing philosophies.

zen shiatsu

Zen Shiatsu is a Japanese healing art that works on the body's energy meridians. In a Zen Shiatsu treatment the vital channels or Meridians carrying our ki (chi or prana or 'life force') are pressed with the fingers, palms, elbows, knees or feet to create balance and restore health in the body.

sports

Sports is a deep tissue massage for sport and occupational injuries. Students completing the Sports massage certificate can provide their clients with the benefits of deep tissue massage as an ideal complement to their sport or conditioning program. Therapists wishing to work with sports teams, physiotherapists, osteopaths or chiropractors will find this course very useful.

aromatherapy

Aromatherapy is becoming an increasingly sought after therapy for people wanting to enhance their daily well-being and obtain relief from stress. While massage therapy is beneficial in itself, combining the use of essential oils in Aromatherapy massage creates enhanced therapeutic benefits.

reflexology

The art of reflexology can be dated back to Ancient Egypt, India and China. It is based on principles that reflex and tension areas on the feet and hands are linked to other areas and organs of the body within the same zone. Reflexology is a complementary therapy, which works on the feet to help heal the whole person not just the prevailing symptoms.

pregnancy

During pregnancy a woman's body undergoes many changes, some of them stressful and uncomfortable.

Massage is a perfect way to reduce stress and promote general well-being. This program has been developed to teach students massage techniques to use during pregnancy that can reduce peripheral swelling, help to prevent insomnia, reduce muscle cramps and back pain, and soothe the nervous system.


Student note Those students unfamiliar with running a business will benefit from the school's 'Practice Management module' that trains you on how to start and successfully manage your new business.

how to enrol

If you wish to enrol in a course please complete an enrolment form for either general interest or professional programs. Both of these forms are available on our website or by contacting our admin team.

Indicate on the enrolment form the course or module you have chosen including the day, date and time. State your first and second choices (in case your first choice is fully booked). The school has four terms a year.

Then **email**, **mail or fax** your enrolment form with the deposit amount (cheque, money order or credit card details). We will send you back a receipt to confirm your enrolment. Alternatively you can phone us to enrol - just ensure you have read and understood our course conditions.

Course entry checklist

To apply to the NSW School of Massage you must:

- Complete all details in the application form
- Have the required English language level (Upper Intermediate-General) for the course you are applying for
- Be 18 years of age or above
- · Pay the course fees according to the fee schedule in your Letter of Offer
- · Obtain and comply with your student visa.

English requirements

All courses at the College are taught in English. In addition some subjects include medical and health terminology, that can be more challenging to understand for students who's first language is not English. Applicants will need to show evidence of suitable English proficiency for the course they have chosen. Details of required English proficiency are updated on our website or you can contact us for more information.

English courses

If you believe that you need further English training before starting our courses we can help. The College has partnered with some of Australia's premier English language colleges to assist students who may not have sufficient English language capabilities. Please refer to our English proficiency fact sheet on our website for full details.

Overseas Student Health Cover

International students studying in Australia must have Overseas Student Health Cover as a condition of a student visa. Australia's national health system, Medicare, only covers Australian citizens and permanent residents.

Student support services

Our student advisors will also help with all aspects of your study. They can assist you with career advice, study skills, advice on academic issues and course planning. They can also guide you through the application process. The College also employs a professional counsellor. Students requiring a counselling session should speak to student services for an appointment and conditions.

Student handbook & policies

Tuition fees

A current fee schedule is available on our website. If your initial application is successful, the Letter of Offer you receive from the College will also confirm the tuition and any additional fees you will need to pay and the terms of payment. Additional fees may include an enrolment fee, your Overseas Student Health Cover, and training materials. Please note that all fees are charged in Australian Dollars. The College subscribes to the Overseas Tuition Assurance Scheme (OSTAS) run by the Australian Council for Private Education and Training (ACPET) to ensure the protection of international student fees.

Course credits

The College may offer credit for subjects recently studied in formal education, recognition of prior learning for previous formal training or experience, and mutual recognition for competencies achieved at other Registered Training Organisations.


as an international student

- · Apply to the College
- · Accept your placement
- · Apply for your visa

If you are interested in studying in Australia and applying for a student visa, you must first apply for admission to the NSW School of Massage.

Once your application has been successful with the College you will receive a Letter of Offer outlining your study fees and a Student Agreement. You then need to return your signed Letter of Offer and Student Agreement to the NSW School of Massage with payment for your tuition fees, so that the College can prepare your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).

This Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) must then be used when you apply and submit your visa application.



Your steps to apply

Steps	Procedure
Step 1	 Complete your application Send it to the College with your application fee If successful, you will receive a Letter of Offer and Student Agreement to study at the College Add a copy of your passport and proof of English proficiency if English is not your first language.
Step 2	 Follow the instructions on your Letter of Offer and Student Agreement to accept your enrolment (study spaces are subject to availability in times that the College is booked to capacity) You need to accept this offer by the expiry date.
Step 3	 You will then be issued a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from the College You will use this CoE to arrange your student visa.
Step 4	 Submit your visa application either with your migration agent, Australian embassy or DIAC office with your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).
